All teams must fill in their player lists to <https://helsinkicup.torneopal.fi/> before registering at the tournament office. The list must contain the players' names and game numbers.

- Teams can field two players who were born a year before the age group of the series in question. These players cannot play in any other teams.

- A tournament-specific permit for overaged players can be requested by 30 June 2019 via email at helsinkicup@helsinkicup.fi.

- If the playing right of a player participating in the tournament are held by a different club than the one the player is representing in the tournament, the coach of the player's own team or the team leader must provide a notification of the matter no later than June 30th 2019 by email at helsinkicup@helsinkicup.fi.

- Each team must register at the tournament office before the first match and preferably on the previous day. A representative of the team (the person may also be other than the specified contact person) must visit the office in person and will be handed out a tournament briefcase and wristbands. Please note, unlike in the previous years, this procedure also applies to teams with accommodation packages.

- Registration at the tournament office opens at 4 P.M. on Thursday the 4th of July. More precise opening hours can be found under the tournament office details.

- When a team registers, the player list is locked and can no longer be changed.

Teams requiring accommodation must state their arrival time, provide accommodation/room lists, and state any food allergies upon making their reservations in accordance with the instructions provided.

The teams are initially divided into groups of six (6) or possibly five (5) teams.

The preliminary rounds are played in a round-robin format from Monday to Wednesday, and the teams placed first and second in the **general** groups will continue on to the A finals, teams placed third and fourth will go on to the B finals, and teams placed fifth and sixth will continue on to the C finals. In the **elite** groups, the teams placed from first to the fourth will continue on to the A finals, while the teams placed fifth and sixth will go on to the B finals. The A, B and C finals are played in knock-out mode until the finals. The losing team is always knocked out from the tournament.

In the B10H to B17H entry-level series, the preliminary group matches are played from Monday to Wednesday. In addition, all teams will play one match on Thursday. No other follow-up games.

After the preliminary divisions, teams proceed to A and B finals. B finals are always played until the final whistle and winners are merited with trophies.

General and entry-level divisions' finals are played on Friday. Both divisions four best teams are merited with medals.

Elite division's finals are played on Saturday and four best teams are merited with medals.

ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT DIVISIONS

All the divisions are played as separate competitions, ie teams do not face teams from other divisions during the tournament (for example elite vs general match-ups are not possible). In each division, the teams are divided into 2-3 groups of five teams. After the first group stage, the teams will continue into A or B finals as follows:

2 GROUPS ==> TEAMS PLACED 1-3 TO PROGRESS TO A FINALS; TEAMS PLACED 4-5 GO TO B FINALS

3 GROUPS ==> TEAMS PLACED 1-2 AND TWO OF BEST * 3RD PLACED TEAMS PROGRESS TO THE A FINALS; THE WEAKEST * THIRD-PLACED TEAM AND TEAMS PLACED 4-5 PROGRESS TO THE B FINALS.

PROGRESSING TEAMS ARE DECIDED BY 1. POINTS, 2. GOAL DIFFERENCE, 3. GOALS SCORED, 4. IF THERE'S STILL NO DECIDING FACTOR, THE TEAM(S) PROGRESSING WILL BE DECIDED WITH A DRAW.

Both A and B finals are played in knock-out mode through to the finals. The defeated team drops from the tournament. On Saturday, only the Elite-level A finals are played. All the other teams' matches will be played on Friday.

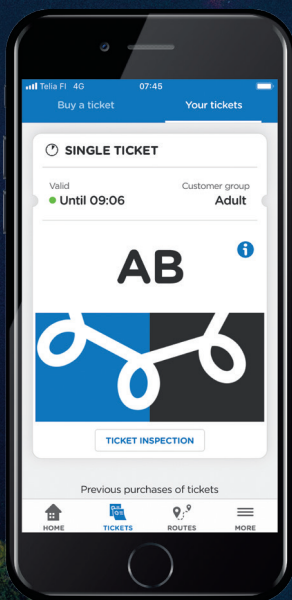

RULES & TOURNAMENT FACTS

MATCH REGULATIONS

The teams must be dressed and ready to play at least 15 minutes before the match begins. If the teams cannot be distinguished from each other, the team mentioned last in the match schedule (the away team) must change their shirts (bibs can be used as away shirts). The goalkeeper's shirt must clearly stand out from the other shirts. There is no limit to the number of players in a team in the tournament. **However, the team size is limited to 18 players per match.** There is no limit to the number of substitutions. The players in the team who do not participate in the match and exceeding the maximum of 18 players, they must follow the game by a clear distinction to the team's substitute players (ie not in game outfit at the bench).

RESERVE PITCHES

If it is necessary to move matches to reserve pitches, the match location and time will be updated on <https://helsinkicup.torneopal.fi/> or into the tournament application. Additionally, the team contact person will be notified by a text message (SMS). If it is necessary to move a significant number of matches to reserve pitches, the tournament organiser reserves the right to shorten the match duration. If this decision is taken, all matches in the age group in question will be shortened into the same duration. The tournament app has the latest and updated information on the match schedule.

OBJECTIONS

Objections on tournament rules and football rules can be raised by a team competing in the same division. Objections regarding the pitch or equipment will not be investigated if the objection is not presented to the referee prior to the beginning of the game.

Objections must be raised to the referee immediately after the match before the referee leaves the match location. A detailed objection must be submitted in written form to the tournament office within two hours after the end of the match. The objection fee is EUR 100. This sum will be refunded if the objection is sustained. The jury's decision is final and cannot be appealed further.

The referee's decisions regarding the game are final according to clause 55 in football rules. Objections to these decisions, in general, cannot lead to a re-match. Despite this, the Jury reserves the right to assign a re-match if the referee has made a decision against the rules.

TEAMS WITH ACCOMMODATION

Teams who have booked the tournament package must let us know their arrival time, provide accommodation/rooming lists, and state any food allergies in accordance with the instructions provided by our sales team. Player lists (filled in completely, including game numbers) and details of the background staff must be entered on the team management page at <https://helsinkicup.torneopal.fi/taso/login.php>. Teams can log in using the team code they received by email upon registration.

ARRIVAL AT HOTEL/SCHOOL, REGISTRATION AND PICKING UP THE TOURNAMENT MATERIAL (PACKAGE)

For teams with hotel accommodation, check in starts at 3 PM upon the day of arrival and Rooms must be checked-out 12 PM on the day of departure. In case you've arrived to Helsinki earlier, it may be possible for you to keep your luggage in the hotel's luggage storage room. More information can be obtained from the hotel's front desk.

Teams can check-in into school accommodations at any time a day before the first game or during the morning of the first match according to your booking.

Please note: every team must register at the tournament office before their first match (unlike previous years this also applies to teams with the accommodation package).

- Registration at the tournament office will open on Thursday, July 4th at 4 PM.
- Detailed opening hours can be found in the tournament office info.
- After registering, the team's player list is locked and it cannot be changed.



ACCOMODATION RULES

We kindly ask all teams who have booked tournament accommodation to follow these instructions and rules, which are applied to both hotel and school accommodation. The team leader or other assigned person who is responsible for the group is obliged to sign the rule form upon arrival.

- Only guests staying at the hotel or school can stay in the accommodation. Outsiders will not be permitted.
- No ball games or other activities which can harm and/or damage the accommodation premises or any movables within are allowed.
- The team residing in the accommodation is financially responsible for any damage done to the premises or movables.
- Making noise and other disturbing behaviour is to be avoided at all times.
- No smoking inside the accommodation premises. Smoking is only allowed at designated areas.
- Guests are responsible for their own valuables – in the hotels, please use the safety locker to store valuables.
- It is prohibited to move any furniture or other moveables outside the room(s).
- Teams in school accommodations are responsible of keeping the classes tidy and will pick up litter into the bins.

GUIDES

- The tournament package includes Helsinki Cup guide services.
- Our guides will meet the teams at the railway or coach station, harbour or airport, and escort them to their accommodation. The guide will bring your HSL public transit travel cards along with them if necessary.
- The guides will help teams to get from their accommodation to the match venues and to the tournament restaurant.
- The guides are based at the accommodation sites and they are available to help teams throughout the tournament.



MEALS

The tournament restaurant is located in the practice hall of the Helsinki Ice Hall. The restaurant's address is Nordenskiöldinkatu 11-13. The entrance to the restaurant is at the side of the Ice Hall nearest the football pitch.

Breakfast is served at the accommodation site, and lunch and dinner are served at the tournament restaurant. Some of the teams have the opportunity to eat at the school in Käpylä. The tournament restaurant is open from dinnertime on Sunday 7th until lunchtime on Saturday 13th. The meals included in the accommodation package start on the day of arrival with dinner and end on the day of departure with lunch, unless otherwise agreed (purchased). Lunch is served between 11 AM and 3 PM and dinner is served between 3:30 PM and 9 PM each day.

Hot food is served, in addition to grated vegetables or green salad, bread and spread, and drinks (water, milk, or juice), as well as a fruit.

NOTE: The tournament restaurant only serves teams who have booked the meals in advance.

KIOSKS

Helsinki Cup kiosks can be found on almost all the field areas. Kiosks' selection include coffee and soft drinks, finger food such as subs, hot dogs and local delicacies, meat pies. Kiosks' also have candy, ice-cream, pastries and chips. Love the Ball Center, situated at the Käpylä field area, also serves hot food.

A Helsinki Cup smart wristband, if loaded with credits, can be used as payment at the kiosk. More information on the tournament wristband can be found on page 18. The kiosks will keep you energized well before the first game in the morning until the last game in the evening.

HELSINKI CUP CHALLENGE

The Helsinki Cup Challenge is an immersive and exciting challenge competition for players of all ages. A diverse range of tasks enables players to challenge themselves, their teams, and other teams. What is the best supporters' chant for your team? Who can clock up the fastest time?

The challenge points are situated in the Love the Ball Center and in other locations. Every player can track their own performances on the Helsinki Cup app. The challenges are registered using the Helsinki Cup smart wristband and are shown on the player's own virtual card, showing the challenge locations and results.

The team that collects the most points in each age group will be entered into a draw, where the top prize will be a weekend of coaching for the team at the Sami Hyypiä Academy. What could be more inspiring than to follow in the footsteps of Sami Hyypiä, one of Finland's most successful footballers?

THE HELSINKI CUP SMART WRISTBAND

The Helsinki Cup smart wristband brings a totally new dimension to the tournament while being extremely practical. All participants in the Helsinki Cup will receive their own tournament wristband, which can be registered on the Helsinki Cup mobile app by juniors or parents in the **MY ACCOUNT** section.

Players can load money on their accounts before the tournament begins and, by activating the smart wristband on their own accounts, they can use it to pay for purchases at the Helsinki Cup kiosks and sales outlets. There is no need to carry any cash, and any money left over after the tournament will be refunded. Parents can also register themselves on the Helsinki Cup mobile app to keep track of their children's accounts and purchases, and to load more money onto the wristband if necessary.

The wristband also acts as a meal ticket for the teams that have paid for meals in advance. The wristband also allows entry into the Helsinki Cup Summer Party and the final matches on Saturday. The wristband also includes a free ticket to the Korkeasaari Zoo.

The Helsinki Cup smart wristbands are given out at the tournament office to the person responsible for each team during registration (team players + four background staff). The wristbands are designed so that they are easy to wear and they do not interfere with play. For safety reasons, players should not remove their wristbands while they are still in the tournament.

MONDAY JULY 8TH 2019

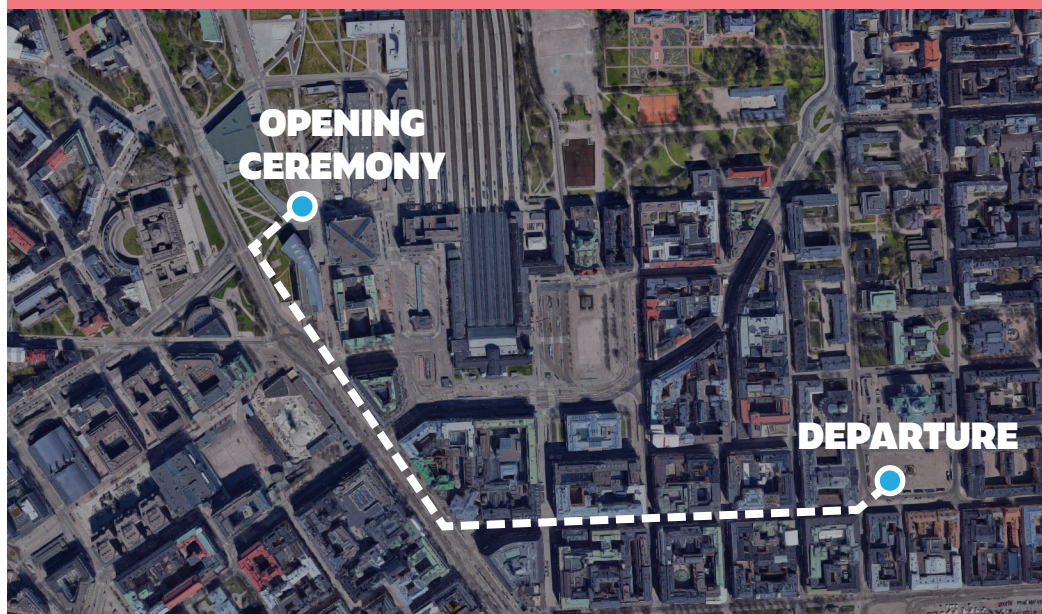
